Qualities of Greatness in the Second Chair (Abishai's Example)

He has no presumption of promotion. (*1 Samuel 22:1-2*)

He has no expectation of recognition. (*1 Chron. 11:20-21*)

He demonstrates support for the leader. (*1 Samuel 26:4-6*)

He is loyal to the leader (*2 Samuel 16:5-9*)

He supports the leader in times of need (*2 Samuel 21:15-17; Exodus 17:12*)
